

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I) Competition and collaboration between organizations or agencies

- ✓ IOM and the definition of environmental migration as a solution to CC

2) Justification and viability of legal protections

 - The **hard law** approach

3) International programs of prevention and mitigation of disasters and emergency relief to people

- **The Hyogo Framework for Action (2005-2015)** the prevention component is forgotten
- **The NAPAs** : integration of migration strategies into adaptation
- The work of the **International Law Commission**: a law for disaster victims under construction



I) Estimating adaptability

- Spatial configuration
- People's perception of their situation
- Climate Information and public awareness
- Social cohesion
- Possibilities for economic diversification et conditions of living

Estimating institutional adaptability

- Identification of emerging problems
- Clear définition of responsibilities
- Coordination between agencies
- Participation of the public
- Rationalisation of the implementation processe



I) **What institution are not doing?**

- They do not recognize climate migration as a policy issue
- They do not recognize the complex causes of environmental degradation or disaster
- They do recognize the need for trans-sectoral action



2) What institutions are doing

- Their main objective is returning to the *status quo ante* rather than improving the previous situation
- They juxtapose rather than mix different policies
- They proceed top-down rather by concertation
